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The model numbers were T or 5T for the Speed Twin, T100 for Tiger 100, 3T for 350 twin & TR5 for Trophy. Typical numbers were thus: 8-T-1234 ( 1938 Speed Twin ) 47-5T-23456 ( 1947 Speed Twin ) 9-T100-45678 ( 1939 Tiger 100 ) Pre-war frames ( 1937 / 39 ) used the prefix TH for the 500cc models ( 5T & T90 ) and TF for the Tiger 100.

TR5 for 1949 was followed by a "T" after the actual number. All other frames were "TF". TR5 models did not have separate number series but ran concurrently with all other models. I.E. 112671 was last 1949 TR5 and 113386 the last 1949 5T. Note: All Grand Prix T100s have letter "R" suffix following engine and frame numbers.
